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OPEN CLASS LIVESTOCK REGULATIONS

Director: Nancy Radke

Director's Note: Open Class Livestock Directors' decisions on any issue will be final!

1. No animal shall be entered in the name of any other than bona fide owner or owners, and should any prove to be otherwise entered, the premiums awarded to them will be forfeited to the Board. Exception: 4-H Lease Agreement.
2. The name of exhibitor, as entered on FairEntry, must correspond and be the same name as on breed registration papers.
3. Substitution of animals within lots, already entered, will be permitted prior to the opening day of the Fair, providing the animal asked to be substituted was owned by the exhibitor 60 days prior to the opening day of the Fair.
4. Exhibitors will be required to keep their stalls and pens clean and alleys free from obstruction.
5. Exhibitors of livestock must inform themselves when their stock will be judged. Stock must be in the show ring promptly after being called. Any person failing to comply with this order will be ruled out from competition.
6. All trailers park in pit area north of the race track.
7. **ALL ENTRY TIMES WILL BE STRICTLY FOLLOWED. NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER ENTRY TIMES CLOSE DURING THE FAIR.**
8. **NO PETS ALLOWED IN THE CORE AREA OF THE FAIRGROUNDS! THIS INCLUDES ALL LIVESTOCK BARN!**
EXCEPTIONS: Service animals and animals that are on the grounds for exhibition in a 4-H or Open Class Livestock event.

SUBMITTING ENTRIES

ENTER USING FAIR ENTRY: <http://bcfair.fairentry.com>

PRE-REGISTRATION DEADLINE FRIDAY, August 9th, 2024:

- All entries registered on FairEntry by **Friday, August 9th, 2024** will be given preferential stalling. Any entries after the August 9th deadline will **not** be guaranteed stalling.
- It is strongly encouraged to pre-register any entries you may bring to the fair.

If you are unfamiliar with FairEntry or do not have access to the internet, please stop by the Fair Office any time Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., or call 605-626-7116 and the staff will gladly assist you!

How to submit an entry (be sure to complete your entry, including the final "Submit" step, prior to the cut-off date.):

1. Go to <http://bcfair.fairentry.com>
2. **(First time)** Click on the link to create a FairEntry Account. **(Returning exhibitors)** If you are logging back in, enter the e-mail & password that you created and click the Sign-In link, then skip to step 4. **PLEASE NOTE:** *If you have a 4-H Online account, specific to SD 4-H, you may use that to login to the Brown County Fair's FairEntry.*
3. **(First time)** Follow the steps to Create Account. **IMPORTANT:** *This must be a valid e-mail address, so that you can receive the necessary confirmation messages. Follow the steps to complete account creation, including entering an address as the Brown County Fair will mail premiums after the Fair.*

Each exhibitor can have multiple entries. One entry must be made for each exhibit. For example, if an exhibitor is bringing two poultry, two entries into the poultry class must be created. Once all entries have been created for the first exhibitor, you have the choice of creating another exhibitor in a family (and entries) or proceeding to check-out (submitting the entries, whether or not fees are charged).

4. Click **Add an Entry** beside the correct exhibitor (if more than one has been created).
 5. Click **Select** beside the first department you wish to enter. After you select a department, you will see a list of divisions to select from, and then a list of available classes. Also notice that there are blue "Change" links in case you mistakenly select an incorrect department, division, or class. After you have selected the class, click the green **Continue** button.
 6. Fill in all of the fields with information about the animals you intend to exhibit. Click **Create and Add** when finished.
 7. If the entry information was entered incorrectly, you have the option to either Remove From Entry (creating a new entry) or Edit Details. When it's correct, click **Continue**.
 8. Complete any additional entry questions and click **Continue**. The review screen allows you to double check your entry. If correct, click **Continue**.
 9. When each entry is complete, you have 3 choices for your next step: You can register another exhibitor, add another entry, or continue to payment. Choose the option that is best for you, and follow the steps to completion.
 10. When all entries are registered, continue to the payment screen. Read the instructions carefully. **NOTE:** Even if you owe no money (no fees are charged) you must click **Continue** to the last "Confirm" step to submit your entries.
 11. Read the information in the "After you Submit" section. You may also have to check a box to "Agree to Terms". Click **Submit** to finalize the entries for the exhibitors in this family. After you click **Submit**, no changes are possible to these entries.
 12. **PAYMENT MUST BE MADE AT THE COMPLETION OF YOUR ENTRY PROCESS! If payment is not finalized by the August 9th deadline, exhibitor will not be guaranteed stalling.**

CHECKING IN ENTRIES

- Please check schedule on pg. 13 for specific check in times.
- Livestock passes will be handed out during check in. Rules for passes are listed on the back, and will be strictly enforced. Vehicles violating rules will be subject to towing.

RELEASE OF EXHIBITS

- Release of open class livestock will be specific to each show. No trailers on grounds before stated release times. Animals removed prior to stated release times will forfeit premiums.

PREMIUMS AND AWARDS

- Awards will be presented to participants at the end of each show.
- **Monetary Awards:** Monetary awards and premiums will be mailed to exhibitors up to 45 days after the fair closes.

SOUTH DAKOTA AND NORTH DAKOTA JUNIOR POINT SHOW

The Jr. Point Show was organized to recognize youth who participate in showing beef, sheep, swine and meat goats throughout the States of South Dakota and North Dakota. Exhibitors range in age from 8 to 21 and accumulate points at different sanctioned shows across South Dakota and North Dakota. Points are awarded to exhibitors, not each individual animal, based on placing in each breed class. Awards presentation is during the South Dakota State Fair and North Dakota State Fair. 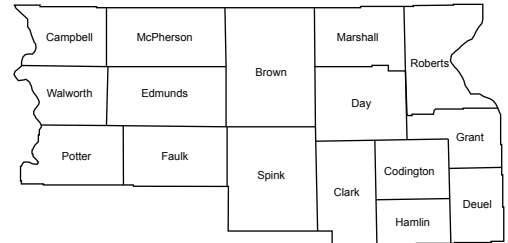

The SD Sweet 16 Showdown will showcase the 4-H Grand Champion livestock from each of the divisions:

- Market Swine
- Breeding Gilt
- Market Lamb
- Breeding Ewe
- Market Goat
- Breeding Meat Goat
- Market Beef
- Breeding Beef



Individuals will automatically qualify for the Sweet 16 when chosen as your county's 4-H grand champion. The Sweet 16 show will place top 5 in each division.

Look for show packets to be handed out at your individual county fair/achievement days. If you were a champion and did not receive a packet, please contact us.

RABBIT DIVISION

Check In: All entries must check in during Rabbit check in times.

Rabbits must be at least 10 weeks old at the Brown County Fair; except for Roasters and Stewers.

Rabbits must come in proper carrying cages with trays and proper wire on the bottom of carriers. Storage space is not available for crates or boxes used to transport rabbits.

Exhibitors are responsible for providing feed and water for their rabbits during the Brown County Fair.

- Only healthy entries will be accepted. Any rabbit found to be diseased at entry or during Fair will be returned to owner or disposed of at the discretion of the Fair Board or it's Representative. Rabbits must have permanent tattoo in the left ear prior to Entry.

Purebreds

State Breed and Variety of each entry on the entry tag. Purebred rabbits will be judged on the following basis: All breeds recognized by the American Rabbit Breeders Association (ARBA) will be judged according to ARBA standards as listed in their "Standard of Perfection".

Meat Pen – Crossbred or Purebred

Trio of rabbit fryers will be judged on the following basis for a total 100%:

Meat Type	40%
Uniformity	25%
Condition	20%
Fur	15%

A trio of fryers is considered three young rabbits the same age, size and color, kindred after June 20th of current year and weighing less than five pounds.

Tips for Preparing for the Show - Tips may vary for type of pet:

1. Take your pet to the veterinarian - a rabies vaccination is required for ferrets and cats.
2. Check for external and internal parasites. Animals can't be shown if they have any parasite present.
3. Learn more about your pet.
4. Prepare your presentation:
 - Start on this a few weeks before the fair.
 - Practice handling your pet so it's comfortable.
5. Have your parents or friends ask you questions about your pet to prepare for answering judge's questions.
6. Handle your pet at least 2-3 times per week.
7. Clean your pet's enclosure regularly, but make sure to tidy it up before you attend the show.
8. Trim toenails or wings if needed.

What to Bring to the Show:

1. Your Pet
2. Travel cage or its normal enclosure. If you need to bring a travel cage, bring along some pictures of its normal habitat to share with the judge. Note: Facilities, including electricity, will not be provided by the show.
3. Food and water to show the judge how you care for your pet
4. Toys or other enrichment
5. Piece of carpet or towel to set on the show table
6. Make sure your animal is comfortable and bring anything that might help relieve it's stress.

As Part of the show, you will give a short presentation about your pet.

Here are some ideas about what to include:

- Your name and age
- Pet's name, species, age and coloring
- Where does your pet come from? What are some characteristics of its natural environment?
- Discuss your pet's overall appearance and health
- How you care for your pet
- How often you groom it
- How did you prepare for the show
- Something special about your pet

You are also judged on the appearance of your pet's enclosure and your own personal appearance. Make sure you are neat and tidy!

Open Class Livestock

OPEN CLASS DAIRY CATTLE SHOW (REGISTERED & GRADE)

Check In:

- All entries must check in during Dairy Cattle check in times.
- Registration papers must be made available at the time of check in for registered animals.
- If the milking status of your female changed between entry and check in, let personnel know at check in, and it will be moved into the appropriate class.
- Animals with sharp or protruding horns cannot be shown for safety reasons.
- If an animal is less than 87% (7/8) of any one breed, it must be shown in the Crossbred division.
- Registered Holsteins are classified as animals that have 87% or more Registered Holstein Ancestry (RHA-NA) as recorded with the Holstein Association.

 36R Best 3 Females; any age, all bred and owned by exhibitor. Exhibitor limited to one group entry per lot.
 37 Produce of Dam. To consist of 2 animals, any age, either sex, the produce of one cow. The Dam must be named. Exhibitors limited to two groups - only one group per Dam.
 38 Daughter-Dam. Both animals to be owned by exhibitor. Limited to two groups per exhibitor. Only one group per Dam.

YOUTH OPEN CLASS SWINE SHOW

Check In:

- All market animals must declare weight and turn them into show officials during Check In time. Once a weight has been submitted, the weight cannot be changed. Scales are available upon arrival.
- Registration papers must be made available at the time of check in for registered animals.
- Exhibitors will be responsible for marketing their hogs as there is not a buying station in Aberdeen.

Arrival time for all species is Wednesday, August 14th from 8:00 AM – 12:00 PM. Weigh-in for swine is from 9:00 AM – 11:00 AM. Weigh-in for all other species is from 10:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. If an animal is late for weigh-in, it cannot be exhibited. Late entry fees will be enforced. Exhibitors can leave once the show is complete.

1. Show is open to all active FFA members.
2. All contestants must own or lease the animal they are showing.
3. Cash prizes will be awarded to the Champion and Reserve in each species.
4. Health certificates must accompany each entry, and they must meet the Brown County Fair livestock rules and regulations (see species specific regulations).

Market Swine

- Animals entered can be either sex, purebred or crossbred. All breeds may enter. Animals will be broken down into classes to be determined after weigh-in (minimum weight of 200 lbs).
- Animals must be born after February 1 of current year.

Dairy Heifers

- Open to all breeds of dairy heifers.
- Classes are as follows:
 - Junior Heifer Calves (Birth Date 3-1-24 & 6 Months)
 - Senior Heifer Calves (Birth Date 9-1-23 to 2-28-24)
 - Junior Yearling Heifer (Birth Date 3-1-23 to 8-31-23)
 - Senior Yearling Heifer (Birth Date 9-1-23 to 2-28-23)

Market Lambs

- All animals entered can be either sex, purebred or crossbred. Classes will be divided by weight. Wethers and ewes will be shown in the same class.
- All animals must be born after December 1st of previous year.

Breeding Sheep

- All animals can be purebred, crossbred or grade.
- All animals must be born after January 1st, 2024, and must be owned by the exhibitor.
