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#### **ENTRY GUIDELINES**

#### ENTER USING FAIR ENTRY: <u>http://bcfair.fairentry.com</u> REGISTRATION DEADLINE FRIDAY AUGUST 11TH. 2023:

- All entries must be registered on FairEntry by Friday, August 11th, 2023. This will help reduce long lines during the check-in process, as well
  as reduce congestion in the building for judges and volunteers.
- Registering entries does not mean that you have to have your entry ready for display by Friday, August 11th. Entries must be ready for display by check-in on Monday, August 14th (see Checking-In Entries).
- It is strongly encouraged to register any entries you may bring to the fair. If you are unable to bring an entry, there is NO PENALTY.

If you are unfamiliar with FairEntry, or do not have access to the internet, please stop by the Fair Office any time Monday through Friday, 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM, or call 605-626-7116 and the staff will gladly assist you!

#### **HOW TO SUBMIT AN ENTRY**

Be sure to complete your entry, including the final "Submit" step, prior to the cut-off date.

- 1. Go to http://bcfair.fairentry.com
- (First time) Click on the link to create a FairEntry Account. (Returning exhibitors) If you are logging back in, enter the e-mail & password that you created and click the Sign In link, then skip to step 4. PLEASE NOTE: If you have a 4-HOnline account, you may use that to login to the Brown County Fair's FairEntry.
- 3. (First time) Follow the steps to Create Account. IMPORTANT: This must be a valide-mail address, so that you can receive the necessary confirmation messages. Follow the steps to complete account creation, including entering amailing address as the Brown County Fair will mail premiums after the Fair.

### Each exhibitor can have multiple entries. One entry must be made for each item. For example, if an exhibitor is bringing 2 photographs, two entries into the photography class must be created. Once all entries have been created for the first exhibitor, you have the choice of creating another exhibitor in a family (and entries) or proceeding to check-out (submitting the entries, whether or not fees are charged).

- 4. Click Add an Entry beside the correct exhibitor (if more than one has been created).
- 5. Click Select beside the first department you wish to enter. After you select a department, you will see a list of divisions to select from, and then a list of available classes. Also notice that there are blue "Change" links in case you mistakenly select an incorrect department, division, or class. After you have selected the class, click the green Continue button.
- 6. Fill in all of the fields with information about the project you intend to exhibit. Click Create and Add when finished.
- 7. If the entry information was entered incorrectly, you have the option to either Remove From Entry (creating a new entry) or Edit Details. When it's correct, click Continue.
- 8. Complete any additional entry questions and click Continue. The review screen allows you to double check your entry. If correct, click Continue.
- 9. When each entry is complete, you have 3 choices for your next step: You can register another exhibitor, add another entry, or continue to payment. Choose the option best for you, and follow the steps to completion.
- 10. When all entries are registered, continue to the payment screen. Read the instructions carefully.
  - NOTE: Even if you owe no money (no fees are charged) you must click Continue to the last "Confirm" step to submit your entries.
- Read the information in the "After you Submit" section. You may also have to check a box to "Agree to Terms". Click Submit to finalize the entries for the exhibitors in this family. After you click Submit, <u>no changes are possible to these entries!</u>

#### **ENTRY TAGS**

- Anyone who has pre-registered their exhibits by 5:00 PM on Friday, August 4th will be able to pick up their entry cards the following Monday after 12:00 PM at the Brown County Fair Office.
- Anyone who has pre-registered their exhibits by Friday, August 11th will be able to pick up their entry cards Sunday, August 13th from 1:00
  PM to 5:00 PM OR Monday, August 14th from 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM in the Home Arts Building. See below for entry check-in times.

### INFORMATION

#### **CHECKING-IN ENTRIES**

- Please bring your entries Sunday, August 13th from 1:00 PM to 5:00 PM OR Monday, August 14th from 10:00 AM- 2:00 PM OR AFTER 4:00 PM, starting at 4:00 PM the Home Arts Building will be locked for exhibitors. Only judges and helpers will be allowed in the building at the time of judging.
- Late Entries: If you do not register by Friday, August 11, 2023 your exhibits will be judged but will not be eligible for Best of Class, Best of Show or the silver tray awards. Please bring your project to the building and you will be provided a colorful entry card to be filled out.

#### **RELEASE OF EXHIBITS**

- Release of exhibits will begin Sunday, August 20th at 5:30 PM to FOOT TRAFFIC ONLY. The Home Arts building will close at 5:00 PM to
  prepare for exhibit release
- Gates will open to vehicle traffic at 6:00 PM and the Home Arts building will remain open until 7:00 PM
- Any exhibits picked up before release time will forfeit premiums.
- Premiums will be mailed to exhibitors up to 45 days after the fair closes.

#### PREMIUMS AND AWARDS

- Purple ribbons will be awarded to all eligible exhibits in Home Arts, Field, Garden & Flower Divisions. Any other placing will get a sticker, and ribbons can be requested at the Fair Office.
- Best of Class and Show Awards: Premiums for these awards will be mailed to exhibitors up to 45 days after the fair closes.
- Special Home Arts Division and Field, Garden & Flower Division Sweepstakes Awards: A silver tray will be awarded to the top Home Arts Division exhibitor and one to the top Field, Garden, & Flower Division Exhibitor. No application required for this award. Your exhibit placings will be automatically tallied. Determination for both sweepstakes awards will be made as follows on a point basis on placing received:

Best of Show: 10 Points Best of Class: 10 Points Purple: 7 Points Blue: 5 Points

#### **OPEN CLASS CROP - PRODUCTION SHEAVES**

- Small grain sheaves must be stripped of all leaves and the roots must be removed.
- 2. Small grain sheaves must be 2 1/2" to 3" in diameter.
- 3. Sheaves must be firmly tied in 3 to 4 places with ribbon or twine.
- 4. Limit 2 entries per lot.
- 5. State variety upon entry.
- All sheaves must have been grown by the exhibitor during the current year.

#### **OPEN CLASS FLOWERS**

Commercial growers may not compete for prizes, except where listed as professional. Professional: Those whose living is derived from the sale of their work. Indicate upon entry. Flower must be grown by exhibitor except Class 6. No arrangements may be made at the show.

- 1. Select blooms that are not quite mature at the time of cutting and are free of insect, disease or mechanical damage.
- 2. Cut stem at an angle using a sharp knife.
- 3. Cut blooms in late afternoon or early evening, immerse bloom in lukewarm water, set in cool place, and allow flowers to "harden" overnight.
- 4. All specimens will be in vases provided by the Brown County Fair.
- 5. Exhibits should have foliage with each bloom, but not below water line.
- 6. When exhibiting flowers with two or more blossoms, all should be uniform.
- 7. Exhibitors are urged to read the schedule carefully and comply with the requirements.




